This year so far......

This year we welcomed new students to Arighi Class. Oliver and Joel came to us from Mulberry and Pearl joined Park Lane from Horton Lodge School. All the new students have settled in really well and have coped really well with all the changes.

This term our theme has been Health and Lifestyles. We have been learning about our bodies and how to stay healthy.

English

In English we have been reading poems and stories about food. We particularly enjoyed "The Dinosaur that Pooped a planet" by Tom Fletcher. We have also been following recipes to make some simple snacks and drinks including rice salad, milkshakes and pizzas with pitta bread. We have also tasted lots of different healthy foods including Persimmon, avocado, spinach and rice milk.

Maths

In Maths we have been practicing our money skills when visiting the café at Macclesfield College. This has also given us the opportunity to develop our speaking and listening and social skills as students have been queuing, using their voices or communication aids to order toast or teacakes and then paying for their food at the till. We have been building and applying our Maths skills in practical settings: weighing and measuring our ingredients when following our recipes and counting and using positional language in Active Maths sessions.

Science

In Science we have been finding out about how our bodies work. We have learnt about the bones that make up our skeleton, we have learnt about the digestive system, our



lungs and heart. We have also found out about nutrition and sorted foods into different food groups.

We have been using food in art, making pictures with Skittles, printing with fruit and veg and making patterns using coloured rice. In Humanities we have covered a wide range of topics including finding out about where cereals and tea and coffee come from. Students have also taken part in Horse riding sessions, Music Therapy, Country Dancing and Music at Fallibroome High School. In Swimming students have continued to build confidence and competence in the water and some students are beginning to swim independently. In keeping with our healthy lifestyles theme this term, we have introduced Yogacise sessions to help us develop flexibility, strength and breathing techniques and every morning Arighi students have the opportunity to complete a sensory circuit to set us up for the day!
