

PRIMARY PE AND SPORTS GRANT: 2018-2019

The Department of Education has given all Primary and Special Schools a sum of money to improve PE and Sport in Schools. For the year 2018-2019 Park Lane School received £16,290

This money has been spent on the following:

- The services of a specialist PE teacher to lead the teaching of PE for all pupils in the Early Years and the Primary Department.
- To contribute to the provision of a qualified swimming instructor delivering weekly swimming lessons in the school hydrotherapy pool and in leisure centre pools
- The organising of whole school sports events using facilities in Park Lane School and Macclesfield Academy, providing all pupils with the opportunity to participate in competitive events.
- To contribute to the Cheshire Special Schools Consortium in order to provide PE and sports opportunities for pupil with a range of disabilities and difficulties including a football tournament. The PE Coordinator is supported to attend regular meetings of this consortium.
- Provided specialist training, for teachers and teaching assistants, on delivering inclusive PE lessons.
- Purchase of specialist PE and sports equipment.

In addition the School invests in:

- Weekly swimming lessons for all pupils, either in our hydrotherapy pool or in local Leisure Centres.
- Horse riding opportunities for pupils with physical and sensory disabilities.
