Summer Term

As we come to the end of the summer term, I would like to congratulate the children in Forest class for a fantastic first year at school. Children in Forest class have worked so unbelievably hard all year and it has really shown in the confidence they ooze and the kind and caring children they have become. You should all be so proud, as this is not just down to the children but the support they are given at home as well.

This term our topic has been Our World. We have read various books such as: We are going on a bear hunt, over in the meadow and can't you sleep little bear. Our lessons have been focussed on these stories, and we have created beautiful pieces of work around these stories allowing for natural cross curricular learning.

We have worked hard to develop our understanding of emotions and recognise how we feel at various points throughout the day so that we can effectively ask for breaks or use self-regulation strategies when we become a little overwhelmed. We have explored patterns in maths starting from looking for repeats in familiar nursery rhymes like 'The Wheels on the Bus' or 'Little Robin Red Breast'. We moved on to looking at patterns within our school day and ordering parts of the day that occur each day such as 'Washing hands, Eating, Play' during each snack time. This set us up well to then learn about repeating patterns and then AB patterns.

In Phonics, we have developed our listening skills, identifying environmental sounds inside the classroom and in the outdoor area. We listened to birds, leaves and water (splashing).

As they year has progressed, we have all developed our physical side, whether this is fine or gross motor skills. We are now all able to walk majority of the way to and from the park. We have developed our throwing and catching skills and participated in our first sports day.

We have enjoyed a variety of SMSC exploration dates such as celebrating International Nurses Day, we are very thankful for our super nurses, Cassie and Sharon, who support and care for us each day. We also celebrated World Bee Day where we explored the world of Bee's, tasting honey, matching bee puzzles and creating honeycomb art pieces.

We hope you all enjoy your summer break and come back refreshed in September.

As we come to the end of the summer term, I would like to thank you for you ongoing support – from ensuring your child has their swimming kits, to messages in home-school diaries to sending in snack money; it doesn't go unnoticed and it ensures that we're able to provide that wrap-around care. I'd like to also take this opportunity, again, to thank you for continuing to make me feel welcome – my email address is lpinkerton@parklane.cheshire.sch.uk should you a) need to let me know anything about your child b) feel like you'd benefit from a chat about anything or c) anything else!

Our curriculum, post-Easter, has focussed on the umbrella topic of Our World. In English we read The Everywhere Bear and the children designed their own journey about where their own bear would go, how the bear would get there and how they might feel along the way; this gave rise to some great work around feelings and differences in how people feel when faced with challenges/situations. Some children accessed sensory-based sessions based on The Everywhere Bear; painting him with yellow paint, putting him in a an under the sea themed tuff tray and taking him to our school library – poor bear! Maths learning has taken on a money/time/measure theme with lots of practical activities linked to height, weight and capacity as well as ordering 1st, 2nd etc. We have used mathematical language during sessions in the jungle gym, during PE and when accessing the outdoor gym during break times; "who is going on the swing first?" "first, pass me a red ball, next a green one..." "the ball pool has less balls in that before and now there are more children in!" using language like this is a great way to embed meaning across the board.

Fridays see us heading to the leisure centre to take part in our weekly swimming lessons, taught by Georgina (George). Mulberry class absolutely come alive in the pool – from those who're taking on personal challenges of being able to swim lengths, widths and float/tread water, to those building their confidence by taking part in staff-lead games. I'm so proud of how far they've all come and how patient they are with each other.

The children have been really settled this term and, as a team, we are very proud of how they've taken to transitions – either going to a new class for taster sessions or welcomed new learners in to the class; from other classes and even other schools. I can't quite believe this time of year has come around so quickly, and hopefully the sentiment of "time flies when you're having fun" is one that is relevant to the children's time in Mulberry class.

For those of you whose children are remaining in Mulberry class, I'll see you in September, for those of you whose children are moving to a different class, I have no doubt that, with your support and the great teams they're moving in to, they will continue to thrive and grow – take care over the summer and please do email if you need anything, I'll be working at some point! 



Happy Summer holidays from all the students & staff of Treacle Class. We have had an actionpacked & fun summer term. Our overall topic has been 'How things work' and we have studied Japan in our 'Bow things work' and we have studied Japan in our

"How things work" and we have studied Japan in our English foundation level class. Within these topics we have managed to incorporate a range of diverse & interesting lessons & topics. We have all worked hard on our individual PLG goals & undertaken a range of personalized numeracy & literacy activities. Here is some more information on a small selection of the work & activities we have undertaken.



English & Literacy

In English & Literacy our focus has been on developing our reading & writing skills. We have undertaken a range of activities to support our PLG's including doing phonics work & focusing on our selected texts. Our texts have been 'The Boy Who Biked the World' by Alastair Humphreys and 'Japanese Fairy stories' in fiction reading ጲ comprehension and, in non-fiction reading & comprehension, a selection of books introducing the culture of Japan. Studying Japanese fairy stories has been interesting and, like Aesop's fables, has given us a variety of discussions about how to be a kind person and to care about others. Studying the 'Boy Who Biked the World' has allowed us to make cross-curricular links with Geography and to greatly increase our knowledge of both Europe and Africa. century. We have all worked hard on our daily reading and phonics activities and are all showing improvement over where we were at the start of the year.



ASDAN

In our ASDAN lessons we have focused on updating & completing our portfolios of work. We have impressed everyone with the pride & care we have taken with our work folders to make them a true reflection of our talents & potential across several different areas. I am very

pleased to report that everyone passed their English and Math's Towards Independence ASDAN qualifications and as such all students should be very proud of their hard work and determination over the last couple of years.



Math's & Numeracy

In our ASDAN lesson we have focused on ASDAN Towards Independence tasks and basic counting and adding skills and I am proud to report that every pupil in the ASDAN class has made outstanding progress. We have had a lot of fun in this class and have particularly enjoyed our Monday morning active math's sessions where we have been applying our math's knowledge to enable us to improve our skill at dancing the Macarena!

PE & Swimming

We continue to really enjoy swimming with our fantastic swimming teacher, George, and we have all made progress with lots of students being awarded swimming badges and certificates for their hard work. We have also excelled in PE lessons; this term we have focused on developing our Athletics skills and we have managed to fit a couple of round-robin football tournaments in. We have enjoyed developing both our throwing skills by learning how to throw the javelin and worked really well in small teams when playing football.



Park Lane School Sixth Form 1 Summer Term 2025

It has been another busy term in Sixth Form 1 and as the academic year draws to a close, I would like to reflect on the achievements of our young people.

The animal therapy instructors have been teaching sixth form 1 students how to look after different animals; this has been alongside their animal therapy sessions. Students have experienced checking the weight of different animals, brushing fur and fleeces, clipping nails, feeding and walking. Whilst taking part in these activities the students have gathered evidence towards the Personal Progress ASDAN unit developing skills of the workplace: caring for animals.

During swimming lessons at Macclesfield Leisure centre sixth form students took part the Swim the channel challenge. They all put in an incredible effort and swam loads of lengths towards the school total.

As part of arts week the Love Music company came into deliver music related workshops to our young people. The session involved singing, body percussion and dancing. It was wonderful to see our students so engaged and happy.

Our students have been taking part in travel training sessions. They have been using Apps like Google Maps to plan different journeys both on public transport and when walking and have gone on to use this information to complete journeys to their work experience placements and to local shops. These sessions have given our learners the opportunity to develop their understanding of road safety and to build their confidence in navigating the local area.

In conjunction with The Cheshire and Warrington Pledge Sixth Form teachers organised Explorer visits for sixth form and KS4 students. Our students visited Shrigley Hall and Petty Pool College to improve their understanding about different job roles and further education opportunities.

Well done to our sixth form leavers who have all achieved diplomas in ASDAN Personal Progress qualification. Their portfolios were outstanding.

We would like to take this opportunity to wish our sixth form leavers well. They have all obtained either further education college places or supported internships. They have all worked incredibly hard during their time at Park Lane School and have developed into wonderful young adults. I know I speak for everyone in Sixth Form when I say we couldn't be prouder.

We hope you all have a wonderful summer break, and we look forward to seeing you all in September!














Barnaby Class

In Sensology we have covered everything from Eurovision classics, to Italian opera. We're such an eclectic bunch when it comes to our musical tastes, and it's ever changing as we listen and enjoy more music from around the world. We've also enjoyed taking part virtually with the Love Music Trust 'Makers of Music' project. A monthly online music session.

Animal therapy has been a big hit for all involved, with confidence growing in exploring the animals.

Our physical skills continue to be an important aspect of daily work in Barnaby, from standing frame to fine motor skills, including switch skills. We've also enjoyed some hydrotherapy, giving us the opportunity to stretch out and feel the movement in the water.



Many of us have used the eye gaze computer to develop our skills here. It takes a lot of concentration, so well done all!







Swimming Summer Term 2025

We have had a successful term swimming, as well as working on our individual swimming targets. We have also taken part in Drowning Prevention Week and our Swimming Challenge.

Drowning Prevention Week is an important week for our students during this they have all engaged and learnt about being safe in and around water. The younger children have learnt what it's like to wear lifejackets in the pool, they have done star floats on their back and attempted breaststroke kicking.

The older children have practiced treading water and the skill of jumping in, floating for 10 seconds and swimming back to the point of entry. All these things are essential skills to ensure we all stay safe in the water.

All students have learnt about safe places to swim, who lifeguards are and the Water Safety Code.

STOP AND THINK – take time to assess your surroundings and look for any possible dangers.

STAY TOGETHER – always swim with friends and family. Swim at a lifeguarded venue.

CALL 999 – in an emergency call 999. Do not enter the water.

FLOAT – fallen in or become tired, stay calm and float on your back.





Swimming Challenge

Everyone in the whole school has contributed in some way to our epic swimming challenge! We have swam the English Channel, that's 21 miles (34,816m) from Shakespeare's Cliff to Cap Fris Nez, France.



This was the first Park Lane Swim Challenge. The children were amazing at swimming lots of lengths and encourage each other, it has really helped to improve their swimming, stamina in the pool and their ability to work together.
