THIS TERM OUR TOPIC HAS BEEN: CELEBRATION

This term we have welcomed some new classmates to Granelli class and watched new friendships develop and grow. It has been a busy but exciting term and we have learnt lots of new things.

Our topic has been'Celebration' for this term. We have enjoyed some great books including 'A squash and a squeeze, 'Its my birthday' and traditional nursery rhymes. We experimented with different foods and learnt about the harvest festival.

In Maths, we have focused on numbers and have enjoyed number rhymes and number lines to count along with. We have counted objects and used sensory trays to explore groups of objects.

Every Tuesday, we have had Music Therapy sessions and enjoyed PE and swimming sessions too. We have got messy making shortbread and pizzas in baking. Move over Gordan Ramsey.

We have been extremely physical this term with weekly PE, swim and the magic carpet which has helped us improve our motor control skills. The pupils have all displayed excellent participation during these activities.

During our PSHE sessions we have been focusing on selfcare and independence. We have developed our handwashing skills, it's really important at the moment.

We have celebrated some birthdays, made decorations to celebrate Diwali and beautiful poppies to commemorate Remembrance Day. We helped raise money for Cheshire hospice and contributed to a Christmas performance. We have been very busy!

Hovis class have had a busy term exploring our Celebrations topic this term. We looked at Halloween, St Andrew's Day, Diwali and Christmas. One of our favourite things to do has been using our technology skills to make foods linked to these festivals. We made shortbread and cranachan linked to St Andrew's Day, following our symbol recipes and activating the blender and whisk by pressing the switch. In Sensology we have been exploring the smell of ginger, the taste of mincemeat, a cymbal crashing, the feel of sand and giving our responses. Some of us love everything, some love just 1 thing but we have all communicated what we like and don't like.

Our topic this term was Celebrations

Challenge- The children learnt about different international celebrations including Moon Festival, Diwali, Halloween and Christmas.

Creativity- The children learnt about famous artists including Frida Kahlo and Vincent van Gogh. They also explored different elements of music such as tempo and pitch.

We have had a great Autumn Term in Mulberry Class! The children have especially enjoyed Music Therapy, Individuality and Creativity. We have been busy baking, making, exploring and learning new skills across the whole curriculum.

Individuality- The children worked in teams to complete different activities such as bean bag relays. We explored different ways of moving including jumping, running and hopping.

English- We read Peace at Last, Handa's Surprise and the Dot. The children wrote about the different characters, settings and wrote book reviews. They also asked their own questions about the stories.

Maths- We worked recognizing numbers 1-10, finding 1 more or less, simple addition and subtraction and doubling.

Barnaby Class

AUTUMN 2021

This term we have had a great time in Barnaby Class. We've enjoyed lots of multi-sensory experiences. In our creative sessions we have been making choices about the different materials and colours that we want to use to produce some really colourful art and crafts linked to celebrations such as poppies, Diwali divas and Christmas cards. We have also explored different instruments and used our voices and vocalisations in Music Therapy.

Our sensory stories have been themed around celebrations with one story being based around Diwali and another around the Christmas story. This has given us lots of opportunities to look at twinkling lights with safe sparklers (light wands) and fireworks (on screen) – we particularly enjoyed a Greatest Showman firework routine.

Sensology continues to be a firm favourite where we get to explore all our senses in one session. We always start and finish the activity with the same pieces of music to help us understand what is going on. Then we work with an adult to explore vision, touch, smell, taste, hearing and proprioception (understanding about our body). For example we were listening to the sound



stretching our legs to prepare for winter sports (touch), looking at tinsel (and touching it if we decided to),

smelling and tasting mixed spice and mincemeat as appropriate. We always finish with Celebration by Kool and the Gang to let us know that we have come to the end of the session. The

same member of staff works with each student for the half term so we can really see the progress, changes in response and confidence growing over the weeks.



We hope you all have a very Merry Christmas and we look forward to our adventures in learning in 2022! We'll be exploring recycling and eco issues in our next topic.





Arighi Class

THIS TERM OUR TOPIC HAS BEEN CELEBRATIONS

This term we welcomed new students into Arighi class. Some moved up from Mulberry and some joined us from other Schools. All the students have made a great effort to form new friendships and they all play and learn together really well. The staff in Arighi are really proud of just how supportive the students are of one another, and how kind and helpful they are.

Our curriculum theme for this term has been Celebrations.

English

In English, we have read Peter Pan and The Alphabet by Edward Lear. All students have been working really hard on their individual reading targets and have been building their symbol vocabularies and learning new signs.



Maths In Maths, students have been working on their numbers: counting to 5, 10 and 20. They have used these skills in practical sessions such as cooking, gardening and Enterprise.

In gardening they have planted bulbs. They also counted the slugs and bugs which they found hidden under some stones.



Other areas of the curriculum

In Challenge students have been learning about sound and they made some instruments of their own. We explored music associated with different celebrations.

In Community sessions, students explored different celebrations and have learned about weddings in different cultures. They also found out about Henry VIII and his many wives and learned about life in Tutor times. They





made a model of a Tudor Building and tasted some food made from Tudor recipes.

In Creativity, students found out about the Mexican Day of the Dead and they made paper marigolds, bunting and sugar skulls. They also looked at the work of the famous Mexican artist, Frida Kahlo.

In Individuality, students have found different ways to travel during P.E. and have been rolling and jumping. They have also used the large apparatus and worked on their balance.



This half term students from Bollin and Arighi joined together to learn songs for the Christmas performance. Everyone took part and some students have shown a real talent for singing and signing.



It has been great fun this term and we are all so happy to be back in school together. All the students and staff from Arighi wish you a very happy Christmas and a peaceful and prosperous New Year.

In Individuality we have enjoyed keeping fit in PE, talking about friends, diversity


